

Short Biography

Robert A. Segal is Sixth Century Chair in Religious Studies at the University of Aberdeen. Previously, he taught for twelve years at Lancaster University, England, and before that taught at several universities in the US, from which he hails. His field is modern theories of myth and of religion.
